Where: Bruce Silverstein Gallery, 535 W. 24th St., Chelsea

When: Friday and Saturday from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.

Rosalind Fox Solomon’s black-and-white photographs are featured throughout the artist’s fourth solo exhibit. The exhibit “evokes childhood memories, parents’ frantic voices and the early imposition of deranged social codes and expectations,” the gallery’s website said.
